Legislative Report

Hearing Schedule (January 16 – January 20).

Hearings of bills being tracked by the North Dakota Water Users Association for the next week are included in this report. We are tracking these bills because they have a direct or indirect impact on water issues.

I. This Week at the Legislature

HB 1020/HB 1080 was heard before the House Appropriations ó Education & Environment Committee on Tuesday, January 10. These are the appropriations bills for the State Water Commission. State Engineer Garland Erbele and members of his staff gave an overview of water projects across the state on behalf of the State Water Commission. Members of the committee presented questions having to do with funding and carryover. Water project sponsors also presented their recommendations during the hearing which included status of projects and funding needs for the upcoming biennium.

HB 1026 was heard before the House Industry, Business and Labor Committee on Wednesday, January 4. The bill was introduced by Legislative Management at the request of the Economic Impact Interim Committee. The bill offers several changes to the One-Call Excavation Notice System (49-23). A change that affects some Rural Water Systems relates to positive response. Positive response has now been defined as notification by the operator to the notification center that underground facilities within the area covered by a location request have been marked or cleared. Several groups provided testimony in support of the bill. There was no testimony in opposition and the Committee recommended a unanimous DO PASS as amended. Amendments were approved by the Full House on Friday, January 6. The amended bill was passed by the Full House on Thursday, January 10, 91-1.

HB 1111 was heard before the House Transportation Committee on Thursday, January 12. This bill was introduced by the Transportation Committee at the request of the Department of Transportation (DOT). The bill is to ensure the DOT director has the authority to enter agreement for the Fargo Moorhead metropolitan area flood risk management project impacting the state highway system. The agreement must address the construction and maintenance of the parts of the project which need to be constructed and maintained on the state highway system. This act is declared to be an emergency measure. The committee questioned the language of the bill and suggested widening the bill to apply to other areas, not just the Fargo Moorhead metropolitan area.

The Senate Natural Resources Committee considered proposed amendments to SB 2047. Senator Dwight Cook believes strongly that appointed bodies should not be able to use quick take authority without the approval of an elected body, so he offered amendments that would require county commission approval before a water resource district can use quick take authority. The amendment requires the county commission to hold a public meeting and invite the landowner to the public meeting before quick take is approved. Other amendments to SB 2047 required that the easement be specifically delineated, and that if the easement is not used, it would automatically terminate. These amendments were offered by Senators Unruh and Roers.

HB 1244 also requires county commission approval before a water resource district can use quick

take authority. This bill does not require a public meeting, but simply requires county commission approval. House Bill 1244 is scheduled for hearing before the House Natural Resources Committee next Friday morning, January 20.

After adopting the amendments, Senate Natural Resources Committee unanimously approved SB 2047 for a do pass on the Senate floor.
